That's because Millcraft Investments has already constructed and opened the 107-room Home2Suites hotel near the Columbia Gas training and operations facility in Center Township, near the Beaver Valley Mall on Wagner Road Extension. That hotel opened in October.

Millcraft is currently building a 140-room Hilton Garden Inn "literally right behind" the Home2Suites on the same plot of land, according to Marcus Piatt, the president of Millcraft's hotel division.

The Hilton Garden, which is expected to open in May 2019, will include plenty of amenities. Piatt said it will include a full-service restaurant that will cater to hotel guests, but he's hoping it will attract plenty of non-guests too.

"We plan on being the best restaurant in Beaver County and attracting outside guests," he said.

The hotel will also include a 3,000-square-foot conference and events room that can accommodate 200 people for weddings, baby showers or business meetings, Piatt said.
